

Chinese and Tibetan delegates representing the Tibet Autonomous Region (TAR) at the Chinese National People's Congress, or Parliament, which opened on March 5, have condemned any possible visit by the Dalai Lama to Taiwan, vowed to continue to roll out preferential financial policies to boost economic and social development in the region, and expressed determination to make Tibet become one of the world's top tourism destinations. But, critics say the principal beneficiaries of such policy are not local Tibetans but Chinese immigrants who are sought to be drawn to the region with such offers and who are meant to overwhelm the local Tibetan population.

China includes second railway line to Tibet in new five-year plan projects

The railway will be built between Tibet Autonomous Region's capital Lhasa and Chengdu, capital of Sichuan Province, according to the draft outline of the 13th Five-Year Plan (2016-2020.

Mangga, 33, was detained on March 1 in Ngaba (in Chinese, Aba) county's Meruma township in the Ngaba Tibetan and Qiang Autonomous Prefecture, after she staged a solitary protest in her township opposing Chinese policies in Tibetan areas.

Tibetan Monk Burns to Death in Kardze Protest

Kalsang Wangdu, a monk of the Maretsokha Aryaling monastery in Kardze (in Chinese, Ganzi) Tibetan Autonomous Prefecture's Nyagrong (Xinlong) county set himself ablaze and died on Monday in southwestern China's Sichuan province in an apparent challenge to Beijing's rule in the first such protest in a Tibetan area of China this year.

He passed on his political leadership to the democratically elected leader henceforth named Sikyong.
